

Adult/Youth Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) Instructor Training

PUBLIC INSTRUCTOR CERTIFICATION PROCESS

The prerequisite to the Instructor Training is taking a MHFA Course in the curriculum that you plan to teach (Adult or Youth). MHFA certificates expire after three (3) years.

To <u>become an Instructor</u>, candidates complete an application (10-15 minutes), self-paced prework (approximately 2 hours), a remote 3-day Instructor-Led Training, and self-paced post work (1 hour).
